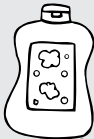
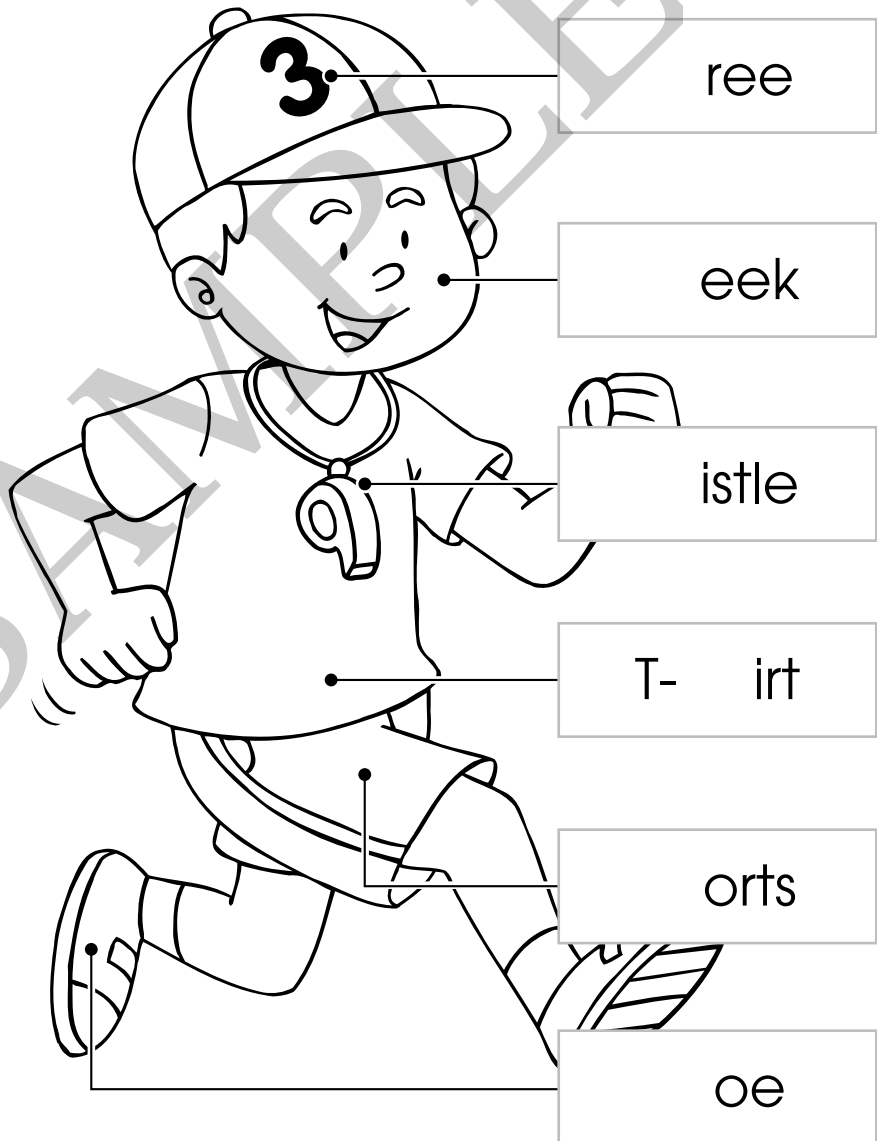
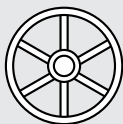
A consonant digraph is a group of consonants that makes only one sound. "Ch", "sh", "th", and "wh" are consonant digraphs.
