Personal, Indefinite, and **Relative Pronouns**

Pronouns replace nouns and noun phrases in a sentence. There are different types of pronouns.

Personal Pronouns (Subject and Object)

Subject Pronouns	Object Pronouns
I	me
you	you
he	him
she	her
i†	it
we	us
they	them

A personal **subject pronoun** replaces the **s**ubject of a sentence.



Sally is the captain of the baseball team. **She** is the captain of the baseball team.

A personal object pronoun replaces the object of a sentence.

I lent my book to Ian. I lent my book to him.

Indefinite Pronouns

Indefinite pronouns are pronouns that do not refer to anyone or anything specific.

— Singular –

- anything
- each

anybody

- everybody
- everythingno one
- someone
- something
- several
- e.g. Everything is set for the party!
- e.g. Many of the people cried in protest.

Singular/Plural

- all
- any
- most some
- none
- e.g. All of my students are smart.





Relative Pronouns

A relative pronoun relates a clause or phrase to a noun or pronoun that is mentioned earlier in a sentence.

Relative Pronouns =

- who
- whom
- whose
- which
- that

relative pronoun a phrase

e.g. The lady who rang the bell is my mom. describes the noun "the lady"

Katie is wearing the necklace that her mom gave her.


relative pronoun describes the noun the necklace"


