Hood: Help! Somebody! Help! There's a big, bad wolf in my granny's house!

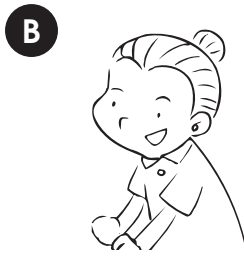
Scene Four

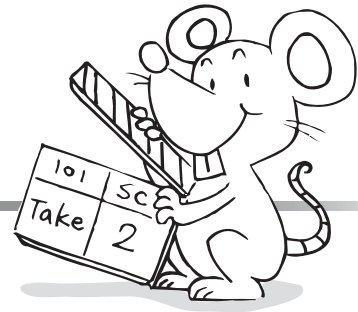
